

Dress for Success

If you're in doubt about how to dress for an interview, it is best to err on the side of conservatism.

It is much better to be overdressed than underdressed.

If you're not sure, go to the employer and look what others are wearing.

Women's Interview Attire

- Solid color, conservative suit
- Coordinated blouse
- Moderate shoes
- Limited jewelry
- Neat, professional hairstyle
- Tan or light hosiery
- Sparse make-up & perfume
- Manicured nails

Men's Interview Attire

- Solid color, conservative suit
- White long sleeve shirt
- Conservative tie
- Dark socks, professional shoes
- Very limited jewelry
- Neat, professional hairstyle
- Go easy on the aftershave
- Neatly trimmed nails
- Portfolio or briefcase

OTHER TIPS

- Dress one step above the normal attire for the job you are applying for.
- You should be cleaner than the person interviewing you. For example, clean out your fingernails and have them trimmed.
- Nothing too loose, too baggy, too revealing or offensive!!!
- If you smoke, chew gum before walking in (and spit it out before walking in!) and wash your hands before the interview.
- Hair should be clean and neat. If you have really long hair, you may consider putting it in a bun or a professional hair style.
- If interviewing at a factory, fast food or construction, wear closed toed (possibly even steel toed) shoes. (They may take you on a tour.)
